Also, if you want to make changes to the recipe they chose, that's ok too!

Finally, food items must be sent in with any necessary serving utensils. All items should be labeled so they get returned. Anything left by your child can be picked up after school on a table in the lobby. Crockpots are great for keeping food warm or food should be sent in pans that can be put in the oven. We have the cafeteria refrigerator and freezer for things that need to be kept cold or frozen. Dinner plates, bowls, napkins, and plasticwear will be supplied by us. Students will provide their own drink.

# Drop off and pick up safety.

Parking areas, driveways, and access roads can be very congested at the start and end of the school day. Please help us keep students safe in these traffic area by only loading students in the designated parking lots and not encouraging them to cross the access road to get in a waiting vehicle.

### Regarding drop off etiquette for Show Choir and Jazz Band:

- Students may be dropped off in the front bus lane for show choir or jazz band between 6:40 am and 7:00 am.
   After 7:00 am, please use the front parking lot to unload students.
- All pedestrians should use the crosswalk to move from the front parking lot to the building.
- All vehicles are required to stop for pedestrians in the crosswalk between the parking lot in front of the school and the awning in front of the building.
- Please pull up as close to the front awning as possible.
   Students should be promptly exiting the vehicle on the passenger side.
- Please do not pull out and around a stopped vehicle in the drop off lane once you have discharged your student.
